Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year	In March our Preliminary Band held a concert called Tea & Tunes on a Saturday morning with free entrance to the public giving inexperienced players the chance to perform and gain confidence. Similarly in December our Intermediate Band held another free concert, Coffee & Carols, open to the public with a chance for band members to play solos and gain experience from playing with piano accompaniment.
	In September the Band celebrated its' 20 th birthday with a weekend of events. On the Saturday a workshop gave players a chance to learn from Brett Baker, a world class player. This event was open and free to all band members. A concert was held in the evening, open to the public with free entry to primary school children. This was an opportunity for players to perform with Brett and also gave the public a chance to listen to music of the highest quality. On the Sunday the Band played at a service at St Michael's Church followed by a BBQ to which past members were invited. To further celebrate the Band's 20 th birthday a new piece of brass band music was commissioned. The music was composed by Alan Fernie a highly respected composer and performed at the concert.
	Our Spring concert, featuring all four bands, including the beginners, was open to the public.
	Concert tickets are always priced to cover costs but additional funds are raised at all concert events by other means such as raffles and offering light refreshment
	In September the band played at the Martlesham Heath Aviation Society Open Day, performing to the public at an important local event.
	In December the Main band played at a Christmas Concert with the local Rotary Club helping to raise money for other charities. The bands also played to the public at supermarkets, and other Christmas events to raise money for three local charities nominated by band members.
	The Main Band has played at two joint concerts with local choirs, St Elizabeth Hospice and The Gippeswyck Singers.
	The Band also provided music for the Remembrance Day Service at St Marys Church Martlesham and for Carols in the Square for St Michaels Church Martlesham and played at Ipswich Music Day.
