Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year	In March the Preliminary Band gave a free concert on a Saturday morning called Tea and Tunes. This gave the members of that band the chance to perform in public both as a band, in small ensembles and in solo performance. In December the more experienced Intermediate Band gave a free Saturday morning concert called Coffee and Carols. This gave the members a chance to play as a band, in ensembles and solo performance. Both these concerts gave the public a chance to see and hear these bands. In the spring the band held a day time workshop for all the bands at which the composer/arranger Alan Fernie, who had composed a piece of music for the band, gave members the benefit of his knowledge and experience. In the evening Alan performed with all the bands in a concert open to the public. Alan Fernie supports Brass in Africa and the band made a donation to that charity from the sale of tickets to the May concert. The band celebrated its 21 st anniversary in September with an all band concert followed by a celebration lunch the following day. Concert tickets are priced to cover the cost of hiring the venue but additional funds are raised by means of the sale of refreshments and a raffle. Towards the end of the year the bands are very busy playing for Christmas concerts for local organisations and playing to the public at local supermarkets collecting funds for three local charities nominated by band members. The band provided music for three Remembrance Day services in Woodbridge, Martlesham and Martlesham Heath.
