<b>DURING THE BAND PRACTICE</b>					
<b>Injury due to fire breaking out at the practice venue</b>	All in attendance could be injured, especially if band members are unaware of safety protocols or procedures relating to fire risk	Bandleaders will make sure that band members know what to do in case of fire. Specifically, we will evacuate the building by all available exits. Band members in the church will assemble on the green, whereas members in the Scout HQ will assemble on the green space in front of the building. A Bandleader will also call the emergency services.  If the band practice is held in the church, the Bandleaders will make sure that the side room fire exit door is unlocked before each practice starts	H		Bandleaders

<b>Risk to children and vulnerable adults associated with Safeguarding issues</b>	Band members taking part in the band practice suffering harm and/or abuse	<p>Band has a Safeguarding Policy which is reviewed annually</p> <p>Bandleaders all receive SafeCIC training and are subjected to regular enhanced DBS checks</p>	M		Band Committee and Bandleaders
<b>Injury due to loss of electrical power causing reduced light levels</b>	All in attendance	Emergency lighting is installed in both practice venues. Depending upon the likely cause of the problem, Bandleaders will consider evacuating the venue as described above for fire risk.	L		Bandleaders
<b>Discomfort or fainting due to building being too hot or cold</b>	All in attendance	We will adjust heating and/or increase ventilation by opening side doors	L		Bandleaders
